newsletters typically cover a variety of topics and happenings at our shelter and school in Cebu, Philippines. This newsletter, however, has one focus – our older residents. We have the highest number of older residents at the shelter that we have ever had in our 45-year history! In response to this, we are expanding our programs and facilities to meet work team, counselors, and house parents work to better prepare and equip these older residents on-site, we are also breaking ground on a new facility to help meet their housing needs and bolster their independence. 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Improving Dur LIFE SKILLS PROGRAM



has a history of placing many children for adoption, and we have tried to prepare them for that as a strong possibility for their lives. But as the population of children who are too old to be adopted has grown, we have changed our programming to focus more on life skills for these residents. These life skills include vocational training, household tasks (cooking, fixing automobiles, learning to build or weld items, etc.), financial management (creating a personal budget, how to save money, etc.) and social skills (how to make and be a good friend, dating, and more). These important topics are typically taught by parents in a nuclear family, but for these residents, CSC is their family. So we continue to work toward improving services for the residents we serve.

The improved and expanded program will help accommodate youth in the shelter for further case management and provision of services focused on independence, self-worth, dignity, and a sustainable and healthy future. The program will better meet the needs of the residents, as it is designed to simulate the conditions of living independently in the community in preparation for their eventual emancipation. The program will provide opportunity and new hope for the older residents to continue achieving their goals and dreams in life by letting them maneuver their plans and decisions. It will guide them with their transitions and allow them to learn firsthand the basics, as simple as the daily living activities and decisions they have to make every day as young adults. It includes education, medical care, mentoring, life skills training, financial and career planning, and job readiness and preparation that provide more focus on independence and autonomy. I'm so excited to see these older youth grow and mature with these extended programs and life skills!













WHY ARE THERE SO MANY OLDER RESIDENTS?

There are a variety of reasons we have so many older residents at the shelter. The landscape of adoption has changed, and fewer older kids are being adopted internationally. The pandemic also put a hold on adoption through the Filipino government, and a number of children grew too old to be adopted. At the same time, fewer shelters in the Philippines are taking in older kids (some have an age maximum of six years old for admission). CSC receives more referrals for sibling groups and older children. Our mission and amazing support have allowed us to offer a home to these children.







are committed to these residents and their needs. Along with life skills, we saw a need for a different type of housing for these residents. In an effort to promote autonomy, we are building a new home with more independent living. The new facility, located on a separate property closer to the downtown area of Cebu, will be the largest building CSC has ever built. It will offer both dorm-style and apartment-style housing for these young adults. The location also allows for easy access to work, education, and public services. We hope this space fosters a nurturing and supportive environment that allows them to thrive as they transition into adulthood.

Residents will be provided with the tools and equipment needed for them to excel, removing boundaries to academic success. Strong and stable internet will be available in all spaces, along with adequate study furniture and rooms. This is more than the average

careers, with CSC aiming to provide educational tuition assistance and on-the-job training opportunities through local business partners.



WHAT IS UNIQUE ABOUT THIS BUILDING?

For the first time ever, CSC will offer residential housing with a combination of dorm- and apartment-style living arrangements. The apartment-style units will have separate living spaces, kitchens, bathrooms, and bedrooms. Initially we'll have six older residents residing in these two units, but there is room for one to two more in each unit. The dorm-style units will have shared bathrooms and common areas with private bedrooms. We could house up to 20 residents in this section, but initially we'll have 14 young adults moving in here when it opens. Besides this innovative approach to housing, the new facility will offer:

- Generous open spaces for individual and group gatherings
- Permanent housing for on site house parents and rotating staff
- All floors accessible with ramps
- Large multi-purpose meeting room to accommodate 80-90 people
- Onsite infirmary
- Onsite therapy and counseling services
- · Library and technology resource center

WE NEED YOUR HELP!

We started increasing our life skills programming during the pandemic, but we continue to improve it, based on the ever-changing needs of the young adults in our shelter. As you read on the earlier pages, we broke ground on the new building and will have 20 young adults ready to move into the new building at the time of opening next summer. The hope is that our programming and housing will be a training ground to encourage independence so these residents can eventually lead healthy and thriving lives in the Philippines, apart from CSC. In order to make this new building a reality, we need to raise funds to finish the project.



As we work to provide the best services possible for our growing group of young adults, we strive to create programs and facilities that will allow them to be prepared to live healthy adult lives in the Philippines. Twenty residents will immediately be impacted by the building when it first opens.



WHAT IS THE AMOUNT LEFT TO FUND THIS PROJECT?

CSC owns the land already, and we have some savings set aside for this, but we still need approximately \$600,000 to fully fund the construction efforts on the property.


