OUR FIELD DIRECTOR, Roberto Atienza

The runde of the Kia's engine was all we could hear as we climbed higher and higher. "Are we going to make it?," asked Ryan.

"Yep, no problem ... nothing to worry about," I replied, though the beads of sweat and strained smile on my face said otherwise. Fortunately, within moments, we were there. Finally shifting to a higher gear, vehicle and passengers alike seemed to give a sigh of relief. We had arrived.

Recently, my family and I took the kids of Duterte Home on an outing to Tops. Sitting at the peak of one of the tallest mountains in Busay, Tops gives a unique perspective of the city. The everyday experience of dusty and crowded streets, the noise of motorbikes, roosters, and crowds, and the heat of the sun on the concrete, all give way to a profound realization: taken together, they make for a city-scape that is greater than the sum of its parts.

The lives of our children at CSC are not unlike the experience of making the climb up to Tops. Stuck beneath the shadows of distant clouds, among the noise and the dust and the heat, it's easy to give in to despair, or anger, or frustration.



But, with the help, love, and support of people like you, our children can lift their eyes and gain a new perspective. The road to this new perspective is difficult, and they will often wonder if they can make the climb.
