

Growing up, I went to a church where we said the Lord's Prayer every Sunday. I don't go to a church with this tradition now, and sometimes I miss it.

On the other hand, I know one downside to reciting the Lord's Prayer is just that: reciting. It can be easy to just stroll through the words, wandering past their meaning - checking the prayer off a Sunday to-do list.

Ministries frequently have a similar struggle. It can be easier to expect a recitation of faith than to seek authentic faith. We could expect our kids at CSC to act as if they have faith, rather than guiding them in a real understanding of Christ and the wonder of a relationship with him.

Our kids see the manifestations of faith every day. They are in the midst of a place filled with the love of God, and the love and prayers of his people. But we don't make common belief a rubber stamp that is expected when kids come through our gates. Instead, we expect their questions and doubts; we anticipate they are wrestling with understanding God's love after they've been through so much pain and loss.

If you're a part of our FrontLine prayer team you know that this often comes up in a prayer request for our kids. One of them may be struggling with a certain doubt, living out their faith in school or any number of the same struggles many of us have had.

This is what makes us rejoice when we do have a kid meet with a counselor, house parent or missionary and decide they are ready to make faith in Christ their own. These are days of celebration, of a deep joy that comes from the only true renewal this world knows. Thank you for being part of a place fostering authenticity, and resisting the temptation of rubber stamps.

### Financial Report: Big Fourth Quarter Push Needed

We are entering the biggest giving season of the year at CSC. The 4th quarter has a tremendous impact on the year as a whole—and what we're able to do entering 2010. In fact, more than 22% of our yearly income comes in during December. It is a time of lots of prayers and faith-stretching for our staff and

board. So much rides on what happens, and yet we know God will provide just exactly what we need.

In the three year cumulative giving graph here, you can see that CSC has done okay in the midst of this recession. But, this year would look much different without a March estate gift—this was

a much-needed miracle. Still, plenty of work remains, and we are operating on a lean budget. We have had to withdraw our entire US reserves to support

- 1. CSC was established in 1979 by a group of young people from Minnesota and Cebu City.
- 2. Vivian and Perry are our workers who have been with us the longest, both having started in the early 80s when the ministry was in Bulacao.



- 3. CSC has cared for 812 children during our 31 years.
- 4. CSC's outreach program helps former residents and families of our children with school expenses and other needs.
- 5. CSC receives support from 74 churches.
- 6. CSC currently has four staff or short termers who are under



30 years of age. We are praying for the next generation of people to lead the ministry in Cebu, and God is bringing young people to CSC.

- 7. Our budget for 2009 is \$1,292,000.
- 8. Cebu Children's Shelter Society of Canada is our partner organization that raises funds for the ministry through Foster Friends and an annual banquet and auction in Abbotsford, British Columbia.
- 9. Our workers include childcare staff, house parents, teachers, social workers, therapists, accountants, drivers, guards, maintenance people, laundry workers and clerical personnel.

is very focused on her studies and in finishing high school. She and Analiza receive tutoring help in the evenings.




